### **Message From Pastor David Rogers**



#### Along Came a Lion

Matthew Henry wrote, "When I cannot feel the faith of His assurance, I live by the fact of God's faithfulness."

Before David became king of Israel, he was sent by his father to check on the well-being of his brothers who were serving in King Saul's army. Shortly after

he arrived he heard the taunts of the Philistine giant, Goliath. Realizing that no one in the Israeli army would come forward to silence this pagan, David volunteered. King Saul was not impressed however as David was young, a shepherd and he had no military experience. David however, presented his verbal resume' which included an encounter that he had had when he had to go into hand to paw combat with both a lion and a wild bear. Since he was there to tell the story, it was obvious that he was victorious over those wild animals.

The lion in this scenario represents an enemy which comes to destroy God's people (the sheep). David however represents the faithful people of God who over-come tremendous challenges by their relationship with God. It was by his faith in God that he defeated the lion and the bear and later the mighty Goliath. Each challenge was a stepping stone designed to equip him to meet future tests and trials.

1 Samuel 17:34 says, "And David said unto Saul, Thy servant kept his father's sheep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock." "Normally we think of a lion not as a blessing from the Lord but only as a reason for alarm. However, the lion was God's opportunity in disguise. This is not "half glass full" optimism but this is remembering that God promised that He would not allow us to be tempted above our ability to endure (1 Cor. 10:13). In the Fall of 2015, the Mount Olive Seventh-day Adventist Church reached a significant milestone. The members celebrated the accomplishments of their first twenty five years and the continuous development of new programs and services to its members and surrounding communities.

The group effort began with Dr. Steve D. Cassimy and Pastor Arthur Zaft, former pastors of Perth Avenue (now Toronto Perth) and Kingsview Village Seventh-day Adventist Churches respectively, along with some vibrant and enthusiastic members, who embarked on a journey to establish a new congregation in the Rexdale area of Etobicoke.

In October 1990, the Branch Sabbath School opened its door at the North Albion Collegiate Institute (NACI) to the Rexdale community. The name was later changed to Mount Olive Seventhday Adventist Church. The new church was under the leadership of Pastor Arthur Zaft, senior pastor and Pastor Joseph Bulgin, associate pastor, along with sixty (60) members who were willing and ready to do the Lord's work. Later the congregation move to its present location as a tenant. The members worked diligently to bring people into God's kingdom.

Services and programs were implemented to meet its members' need and well-being while out-reach evangelism was its primary focus. Street Ministry, Personal Ministry and Community Services were some of the out-reach ministries that were organized to minister to non-believers. Ingathering, Investment, Church Building Fund and other departmental fund-raising activities were major events that were used in the development of our The physical and social need of our church. members and visitors were met at our Saturday night socials, banquets, boat cruises, walk-a-thons and summer picnics. In the first decade there were Pastors Arthur Zaft, Joseph Bulgin, Theodore Mc Leary (deceased), Manley Coleman (deceased), Samuel McKenzie, and Ledford Morris.

The second decade saw continued growth and implementation of new services and programs in the church such as; preparing and delivering hot meals to one of the women shelters for battered women and children monthly, supplying food to Youth Without Shelter, volunteering at one of the seniors homes in the Etobicoke area, feeding the homeless in downtown Toronto, setting up the food bank and soup kitchen, running the options for youth program, women's retreats, preparing and delivering sack lunches to one of the youth shelters in Toronto and recognizing the seniors on their birth months. Additionally, School supplies were given to children and youth in the church and communities.

The congregation also opened its doors to other denominations who rented our facilities for worship and social gathering. Pastor Morris continued in the second decade and the church was purchased under his leadership. Pastor Morris holds the distinction of being the longest serving minister of the church; he served for eleven (11) years. The congregation also had Dr. Kenneth Campbell (retired) and Pastor Joseph Amankwah who served for approximately three (3) years. Pastor David Rogers and Stanley McFarlane later joined the congregation in September 2010. On August 21, 2016, Pastor McFarlane and his family said farewell to the church. Pastor Rogers is still currently serving.

As the church reflected on twenty five (25) years of service to its members and the surrounding communities, we can certainly say that God has brought us this far and we are grateful for His divine care, love and mercy. What began as a Branch Sabbath School with sixty (60) members has blossomed into a congregation of three hundred and eighty Six (386) members and counting.

With divine assurance, the congregation can sincerely say "To God be the glory great things He hath done."

#### **Community Services Report**

Mount Olive Adventist Community Services is a vital member of the North Etobicoke Community. The work of the Community Services department entails striving to end hunger through our weekly Foodbank and Soup Kitchen programs while supporting the Fresh Start program which provides food for over 60 seniors in Etobicoke. Our outreach spans over 6000: half of whom are children from a diverse socioeconomic community rich in culture, language and religions including new immigrants. As a pivotal partner in the North Etobicoke community, Mt. Olive Community Services strives to improve the quality of life for its constituents. It is by God's Grace and direction that the department is steered in its pursuit to minister to the needs of our community.

Engaging community response through the form of Health Fairs, AY programs, joint Parenting Conference and Dietetic and Nursing services for our clients, has positioned our church in a positive light among our partners and those we serve. Our community partners for 2016 included, Deputy Mayor Crisanti's Office, Toronto Public Health, Toronto Police 23 Division, Etobicoke Strategy, North Kipling Junior Middle School, Etobicoke Health Centre, Rexdale Alliance Church, Daily Bread Foodbank, Second Harvest Food Rescue, Fresh Start and Mt. Olive Health and Temperance department.

In June 2016, Mt. Olive Adventist Community Services, the Etobicoke Strategy, Deputy Mayor Crisanti, the Toronto Police and Toronto West Seventh-Day Adventist Church held a Prayer Rally in response to the fight against violence and a recent shooting at the Toronto West SDA Church. We also took part in the Healthy Kids for our Community forum whereby Mt. Olive was depicted as an open door network for supporting our local community. Several requests for services were addressed along with referrals for CCAC, Health and Dental services, Legal and Mental Health services.

Our own Sis. Betty Kennedy provided blood pressure checks for our clients both internally and externally. Dietetic and Nursing services were established to supplement our client's experience in developing a healthier lifestyle. For example diabetic screening and health checks were conducted and referrals or registrations for free services have become an intricate part of our outreach experience. Several boxes were prepared for shut-ins. We wrapped up the year with an amazing community dinner and a grand public recognition of our volunteers made possible by Deputy Mayor Vincent Crisanti and his team.

We received approximately 75,000 pounds of food valued at over \$135,000 collectively from both Second Harvest and The Daily Bread. We were blessed with bread and pastries also from Rexdale Alliance Church, Sis. Chin, Rrope and Cob's Bakery. Individuals also donated over \$1,000.00 in cash and over \$500.00 in kind.

Our programs will continue in like manner in 2017 with the addition of a Pedestrian Safety program to bring awareness and behavorial change within our community, expansion of our breakfast program and the introduction of a Parenting Club. #### Tell me about yourself?

Ever since I was a little girl I was fascinated by who God is. I remember asking my mom one day "if everyone comes from Adam and Eve and Adam and Eve came from God, then where did God come from?" Going to church with my neighbor was the

start of my relationship with God. I loved going to church and when we migrated to Canada the trust I had in God as a child was put to the test.

On visits to Jamaica to stay with my grandparents my quests for deeper knowledge of God and the universe grew. After moving to Toronto I pursued further studies from *Voice of Prophecy* and *IT Is Written Canada*. Later when we found Toronto East SDA church my siblings and I joined Pathfinders and I became a Master Guide. I enjoyed taking part in church and sharing my love for God with whom everyone I came in contact.

As I grew, my experiences drew me closer to God. I saw His promises materialize in my life and my relationship with Him bloomed. However my calling did not stop at the young people, but through constant communication and a strong faith, I joined Community Services working with Bro. Joseph Mitchell, Sis. Goffe, and Bro. Jones, over the years. Bro. Mitchell's ability to connect with the community leaders was impressive and I learned a lot about ministering to those outside of the church. In 2009 I was called to work with the GTA Adventist Federation of Community Services. As secretary for the Federation I found joy in serving the community by coordinating all the volunteers for the division. Special projects I was involve with included Peel District School Breakfast program at Clark Junior Public School, Toronto Community Living Foodbank, St. Leonard's Place in Brampton, Ernestine Women's Shelter, Youth Without Shelter, Kendleton Senior's Complex and Scott's Mission.

I returned to Mt. Olive in 2012 to assist Bro. Radcliffe Lennon with Community Services. Since then God has led the department to great heights. We have built on our experiences a bridge to the world around us. I believe if we truly believe we serve the King of the Universe, the sky is the limit.

#### Your passion for Community Services has been phenomenal. What motivates you to work in this ministry?

I love the Lord. I am motivated by God's love and forgiveness towards me. I believe working with Jesus to minister to others is a commission Jesus gave to all who will follow Him. The more I see God's blessings in my life, the more I realize He is real. When I pray He answers and as long as He continues to direct me I will serve Him in whatever capacity He wills. My family also plays a big role in my motivation. Their encouragement and love gives me strength and that push when I feel weak.

#### What are some of the challenges you faced in Community Services and how have you overcome them?

My challenges are often revealed by the Lord to be originated by Satanic influences. I overcome them by allowing Jesus to fight my battles. He knows me and whatever the struggles I am faced with I take it to the Lord. He is my best friend and I can overcome anything with Him by my side.

### What is the most rewarding experience in Community Services?

My most rewarding experience is allowing God to use our simple efforts to make a big difference in the lives of those we serve. To hear someone say "This is my church, it's because of what you did", that gives me joy. Then I know God's love is working.

#### What are some of the programs you would like to have implemented in the church to help the newly baptized members?

I would like to implement some of the following programs whereby the newly baptized can see that membership means growth and giving back to God.

- A Parenting Club to help build the relationship between parents and children
- An open Breakfast program that allows the public to come into the church and we minister to them without worrying about them interfering with the status quo
- The love for others to be a pivotal part of being a Christian and new members would freely volunteer to join Community Services
- A joint ministry for everyone in the church portraying the Love of God in a positive manner to their neighbours.

Interview with Personal Ministries Director, Elder Keith Williams: By Sis. Caron Williams



**Elder Keith Williams** is a committed soldier in the Lord's army. He is quite passionate about the work of Christ and believes in the power of prayer. He believes that there is a great work to be done and thinks that everyone should be disciple of Christ. A former member of the Pentecostal faith, he accepted

This experience fueled his fire even more and when asked to be the Personnel Ministry Director he readily accepted.

### What do you think is the role of the PM Department?

The role of the PM Department is to inspire, equip, train and motivate all members of the church to spread the Christian gospel by public preaching or witnessing.

## The theme for 2017 is Community Outreach and Evangelism. What does this mean for the church?

This means that our efforts will be focused on being more visible in the Rexdale Community. My good friend Radcliffe would have always made mention of Christ strategy for evangelism in that he fed them, clothe them and then bid them to follow Him. We need to do the same. Too often we tell others that Jesus loves them but we are seldom willing demonstrate that love to those who are in to need. We already have the Community Food bank in place and we usually go to the nursing home every 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday to sing along with the residence for an hour. I do wish that more of our members can make themselves readily available. We do need to do more so that it will be easier for us to share Christ with those we come into contact with.

### What other activities does the PM Department plan to undertake in the near future?

We are planning a Community Meet and Greet for September 3<sup>rd</sup>. 2017. This would require the participation of the entire church. We would be providing back to school items, a Health symposium, Pathfinder and Adventurers Promotion and Registration, Prayer sessions. We are also making preparation to have our Vacation Bible School for the Summer of 2017. The Communication Department is also putting together bags to be distributed on Sabbaths to our visitors. In addition, I would like to see us offer a tax clinic for the next tax seasons to those in our community and the restarting of our homework club.

### What is the greatest challenge you see in the church fulfilling its objective for 2017?

The greatest challenge I see is the mobilisation of our members to get actively involved in evangelism and community service.

### What are some to the church activities that can offer opportunities for witnessing?

There are a variety of church activities that offer opportunities for witness including:-

- First, ask God for help and leading.
- Know that every environment is a potential mission field be it home, work, school or socially
- Seek opportunities to share God's love e.g. food and blood drives.
- Start a lunchtime bible study with friends, family and co-workers.
- Work with excellence and integrity in all your undertakings
- Form prayer partnerships.
- Invite non-Christian friends, family and coworkers to gatherings that you can freely share your faith and the gospel including those with a Christian atmosphere and theme.
- Do not hide or downplay the importance of your faith. Use scripture, prayer and your testimony where and when it naturally fits into the setting or conversation.
- Follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

- 4. Recognize that you are an ambassador for Christ and therefore have the right and obligation to visit even the people of great importance and influence. 2 Cor.5:20
- 5. Through a wise use of words, help the prospect to realize their spiritual, moral and physical need, and that you offer the solutions. John 4:10

#### What is Colorectal Cancer

Colorectal cancer is a malignant tumor that starts in cells of the colon or rectum. These tumors can metastasize and spread to other parts of the body. The colon and rectum are parts of the large intestine a digestive system. Colon and rectal cancer are grouped together as colorectal cancer, because they are made of the same tissues. Sometimes cells in the colon and rectum change pattern which can lead to abnormal growth known as polypus. These can be benign or malignant. Colorectal cancer most often starts in cells that line the wall of the colon or rectum.

**Screening-** Checking for the disease helps any signs or symptoms appears. When colorectal cancer is found and treated, early treatment is more meaningful and there is a better chance of survival. Screening Tests may include checking the stool for blood, as some polypus will bleed on a colonoscopy. It is recommended that those in the age group 50-75yrs of age or older should have a stool test every 2 years. Family physician usually determine which test is better for the patient.

**Colonoscopy and Sigmoidoscopy-** A light sedation is required for this test. The doctor uses a long tube with a camera at the end to visualize the lining of the colon. If polyps are detected, the physician will remove them, there and then. This test is normally done every five years, but can be done more frequently if the physician deem it necessary.

#### What puts you at Risk?-

- 1. Parent, sibling or child with colorectal cancer.
- 2. Personal history of non cancerous (benign) polyps in colon or rectum
- 3. Ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease

#### Signs and Symptoms

- diarrhea/constipation
- stool that looks narrow, pencil-shaped
- feeling like the bowel is not completely empty after a bowel movement

- blood in the stool (bright or very dark red)
- bleeding from rectum
- pain or discomfort in the rectum
- gas, cramping, bloating and feeling full
- a lump in the abdomen or rectum
- fatigue and weakness
- anemia
- nausea and vomiting
- loss of appetite
- weight loss
- frequent urinary tract infections
- swollen lymph nodes
- jaundice
- pain in the abdomen, buttocks or leg
- breathing problems

#### Diet

A healthy balanced diet that includes a variety of fruit and vegetables, whole grain , bean protein, low fat milk products and healthy fats have been linked to a decreased risk of colorectal cancer. A recent study (Nomura, 2008) concluded that eating more fruits and vegetables protected men from colorectal cancer and past similar studies showed the same protective effects in men and women (Park 2007, Kouskik 2008). Green, leafy vegetables such as broccoli and spinach are highly recommended for their nutritional content and whole fruits are excellent sources of carbohydrates to consume. They contain important antioxidants. Use whole grain such as oats- barley and whole wheat, beans, lentil, chickpeas, whole wheat pasta, spelt pasta. Avoid unhealthy fat found in cakes, cookies fried food, margarine. Use unsaturated fats found in fatty food like salmon- avocados, olive oil and nuts. (See recipes on following page.)

Drink plenty of water. Get plenty of exercises. Remember this cancer will respond better to treatment when it is confined inside the colon or rectum. Once it comes out and starts to spread and invade other organs it will be more difficult to manage and prognosis becomes poorer. Watch for any of the signs and symptoms and make a trip to the doctor's office.

#### **Red Cabbage and Carrot Saute**

- Ingredients (2 servings): 2 tsp coconut oil
- 3 cups red cabbage, cut into strips
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup shredded carrots
  - 2 tsp rice vinegar
  - 2 tbsp pine nuts

  - 1 tbsp honey 2 tsp chia seeds

#### Directions:

- 1. Melt the coconut oil in a pan on medium heat. Toss red cabbage strips into pan and cover. Sauté for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 2. Lower the heat and add shredded carrots, rice vinegar, honey and pine nuts. Stir and cover with lid to sauté for another 5 minutes.

Stir in the chia seeds near the end. Serve warm.

#### Garlic Parmesan Mashed Cauliflower Ingredients (Serves 2):

- 1 head of cauliflower, chopped into small florets
- 2 cups vegetable broth
- 2 cups water
- 2 tbsp almond milk (original)
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp minced garlic
- 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 tbsp green onions, finely chopped
- 1/4 tsp sea salt
- 1/8 tsp pepper

#### Directions:

- 1. Pour vegetable broth and water into a large pot, and bring to a boil. Add cauliflower florets and boil uncovered, stirring occasionally, until florets are very soft- about 12 minutes.
- 2. Drain water/broth mixture from cauliflower. Place cauliflower into blender with almond milk, grated Parmesan cheese, minced garlic, sea salt and pepper, and blend until smooth. Add

in chopped green onions and blend for another 15 seconds. Pour into a serving bowl. Garnish on top with a little more chopped green onion and grated Parmesan and serve warm!

#### Black Bean Burger with Creamy Avocado Sauce Ingredients:

#### Burger:

- 1 15 oz. can low sodium black beans, drained and rinsed
  - 1/4 cup chopped onions
- 1/2 cup panko crumbs
- 1 flax egg
- 1 teaspoon oregano
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Whole wheat hamburger buns

#### Avocado Sauce:

- 1 ripe avocado, peeled, pitted and cut into chunks
- 2 tablespoons non-fat Greek yogurt
- 1/8 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/8 teaspoon salt

#### **Directions:**

#### For Burger (Can also be used as an entre)

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees and lightly spray baking sheet with cooking spray.

2. Drain and rinse beans in a colander and place in large mixing bowl. Mash beans with a fork until pasty with a few whole beans mixed throughout.

3. Add panko crumbs, onion, flax egg, oregano, salt and pepper. Mix together and make 4 patties. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes on each side.

#### For Avocado Sauce:


- 1. Peel, pit and cut avocado into chunks and place in food processor.





In these morally challenged times - when billions are embezzled by corporate executives, when trusted spiritual leaders prove false, when lying in politics seems to be the norm, when those you depend on the most often hurt you the deepest - is there anything left you can trust? Yes! You can fully trust the Bible! Why? Just take a look at the evidence...



1. What does the Bible claim about itself?

The Bible says, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God." <u>2</u> <u>Timothy 3:16</u>. "Prophecy

came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost." <u>2 Peter 1:21</u>. "The scripture cannot be broken." John 10:35.

**Answer:** It claims to be inspired. It was written by men who were guided by the Holy Ghost. It cannot be broken or proved untrue.



2. How did Jesus demonstrate His confidence and belief in Scripture?

Jesus said, "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone." "It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God." "It is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve." <u>Matthew 4:4, 7, 10</u>. "Thy word is truth." <u>John</u> <u>17:17</u>.

**Answer:** Jesus quoted Scripture when meeting the temptations of Satan. He also stated that the Bible is truth John 17:17. Jesus often quoted Scripture as authority for the truth He was teaching.



Before Cyrus was born, God's Bible prophet named him as the general who would overthrow Babylon.

### 3. Do Bible prophecies confirm inspiration?

The Bible says, "I am the Lord . . . new things do I declare: before they spring forth I tell you of them." <u>Isaiah 42:8, 9</u>. "I am God . . . Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done." <u>Isaiah 46:9, 10</u>.

**Answer:** The Bible predictions of things to happen in the future confirm the inspiration of Scripture as they come to pass.

Notice the following examples of fulfilled Bible prophecies:

- Four world empires to arise: Babylon, Medo-Persia, Greece, and Rome Daniel chapters 2, 7, 8.
- Cyrus to be the warrior to capture Babylon <u>Isaiah 45:1-3</u>.
- After Babylon's destruction, it would never be inhabited again <u>Isaiah 13:19</u>, <u>20Jeremiah</u> <u>51:37</u>.
- Egypt would never again have a commanding position among the nations <u>Ezekiel</u> <u>29:14</u>, <u>15 30:12</u>, <u>13</u>.
- Earth-shaking calamities and fear toward the end of time <u>Luke 21:25</u>, <u>26</u>.
- Moral degeneracy and decline of spirituality in the last days <u>2 Timothy 3:1-5</u>.

### 4. Can we expect scientific statements made in the Bible to be accurate?

The Bible says, "Thy word is true from the beginning." <u>Psalms 119:160</u>. "The Spirit . . . will guide you into all truth." <u>John 16:13</u>.

**Answer:** Yes, the Bible is true. The Holy Spirit, who guided the Bible writers, always speaks the truth. Here are a few Bible statements that have been confirmed by science:

- "He . . . hangeth the earth upon nothing." <u>Job</u> <u>26:7</u>. This scientific fact is from Job, the Bible's oldest book.
- "He . . . sitteth upon the circle of the earth." <u>Isaiah 40:22</u>. The Bible said the earth is round centuries before man found out.
- "To make the weight for the winds." <u>Job 28:25</u>. Long before scientists knew, God said air has weight.
- "By Him [Jesus] all things consist." <u>Colossians</u> <u>1:17</u>. The word "consist" here literally means "hold together" or "cohere." Many Bible translations put it "hold together." This is the answer to the nuclear physicists' worrisome question about the atom. The real mystery of the atom does not involve its benumbing megapower, but rather, "Why doesn't the atom fly apart?" Scientific knowledge says it should, but it doesn't. Some scientists are wondering what puzzling power, completely unknown to them, is holding it together. The Bible says that mysterious power is the Creator, God Himself.

### Many diseases would not exist if God's ancient laws regarding morality were obeyed.



## 5. Are biblical health principles tuned to the twenty-first century mind?

Answer:

Cover body waste with dirt <u>Deuteronomy</u> 23:12, 13.

The Bible provision of Moses' day that body waste should be buried was 3,500 years ahead of its time and saved countless thousands of Jewish lives. Major problems still arise when sanitation is not properly handled.

#### "Neither let us commit fornication." <u>1</u> <u>Corinthians 10:8</u>.

The word "fornication" denotes all kinds of immoral sexual conduct. There would be no AIDS epidemic if this up-to-date Bible counsel were obeyed, nor would abortion be the international scandal that it now is.

If this extremely effective Bible solution were implemented, just think what it would mean:

Millions of alcoholics becoming sober, respectable citizens.

- Thousands of government, business, and professional leaders making clear-minded decisions.
- ◊ Billions of dollars available for humanitarian use.

*Note:* God not only tells us how to succeed with joy amid today's harrowing problems, but He also gives us the miraculous power to do it (<u>1 Corinthians 15:57</u>, <u>Philippians 4:13</u>, <u>Romans 1:16</u>). Bible health principles are relevant and desperately needed, but few are listening.
